M. CITY COUNCIL/CITY ADMINISTRATION RESPONSE/REPLY TO PUBLIC COMMENT FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA FROM TROY RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES:

Mayor Baker responded that City Council Rules does not allow proclamations for awareness days, but there is a possibility to light up City Hall purple on March 26th for Epilepsy Awareness Day.

Council Member Bluhm commented that she fully supports Epilepsy Awareness Day and their efforts.

Council Member Chamberlain encouraged Project Synara to email the City Council general email with information about upcoming events so Council can attend.

Council Member Brooks thanked Project Synara for coming forward tonight and offered to share information and events on her social media page.

Council Member Gunn appreciated Project Synara for sharing information tonight and he offered to share information on his social media page.

Mayor Pro Tem Chanda thanked Project Synara for sharing information tonight and offered support for promoting their events. He also suggested that this information be shared with first responders.

Council Member Chamberlain requested more information and the status of Neighborhood Nodes. Mayor Baker said that proposed language and amendments is on the Planning Commission agenda tomorrow night.

Council Member Chamberlain commented that the density in office to residential conversions make sense in those areas. She said there is a potential issue with two bills in committee in Lansing: HB5529 and HB5532 that take away control from local municipalities in the effort to increase housing available throughout the state, but at the expense of density issues.

Mayor Baker commented that SEMCOG is holding a press conference tomorrow that he will attend. He said that the MML is circulating a letter for local officials to sign supporting saying no to these bills and he has already signed this letter. He encouraged residents to pay attention to and speak up regarding these bills.

Council Member Brooks said she spoke with State Rep MacDonell expressing concern regarding these bills and she encouraged residents to contact their state representatives. She said these bills come from a good place addressing the housing shortage but taking away local control would cause a lot of problems for Troy residents.

Mayor Pro Tem Chanda commented that the housing shortage is a real issue, but every community is different and local officials know what is best for their residents. He said that office space conversion to residential is good and has been successful in Troy.

Council Member Chamberlain said she is glad Mayor Baker will be attending the press conference. She asked if there could be consensus of Council to draft something regarding the legislation. She also commented that this is happening throughout the United States.

Council Member Gunn commented that converting office to residential is good, but it is important to consider who will want to live in the spaces. He said he has observed more collaboration between developers and Planning for more greenspace over the past few years.

Council Member Chamberlain said she will be out of town during the State of the City address. She thanked Mayor Baker for bringing forward the AI Playbook, and would be interested in seeing a report from City Staff.

Council Member Chamberlain commented that it is a rare moment when so many sacred events converge at the same time. She said in Troy and Michigan, it is tree-tapping season for making maple syrup and the opening of the new Sugar Shack at the Nature Center. She commented on growth and renewal being just below the surface during the cold of winter.

Council Member Gunn commended the youth of Troy promoting Epilepsy Awareness, Sienna Nguyen on her outstanding leadership accomplishments, and an International Academy student who is advising teachers on the use of AI. He said he looks forward to participating in the tree tapping events. He also commented that he is supportive of the comments circulating looking to build a large gold medal to hang from the Gordie Howe bridge. He congratulated all of the Olympic athletes.

Council Member Bluhm commended the youth of Troy for their rare and special engagement efforts within the community. She applauded Mayor Baker for his involvement with the US Conference of Mayors for engagement and cross-learning, and she appreciated the valuable information on AI.

Council Member Brooks commented in agreement that the conversations on AI need to continue. She commented that March is a big season for maple syrup at the Nature Center to participate or

volunteer. She clarified some comments from the last meeting regarding traffic at Long Lake and Rochester Road. She said there is no through traffic on Long Lake and stressed that drivers cannot cut through properties and noted that there is signage posted prohibiting cutting through properties.

Mayor Pro Tem Chanda commented on the importance of learning about the ethical issues with using AI. He commented that the Troy High Hammerheads robotics team are having an event on Thursday where you can see their robots in action. He also commented on celebrating multiple holidays converging at the same time.
