Council Member Gunn responded that he would like the City to have a resource for injured animals that can be brought in during emergencies like with the owlet; he complimented the students who promoted and advocated for Rise Above OCD; he is pleased to see the cricket field in the community.

Council Member Bluhm responded that Rise Above OCD would benefit in including the Community Center and community organizations in their community outreach; she appreciated the comments regarding the cricket field and agreed that affordability and accessibility is important with youth sports.

Mayor Pro Tem Chanda responded and thanked the resident for helping the owlets; he is eager for the cricket field and would like to see it used to the full extent; he thanked the students for their presentation and offered assistance to spread the word for Rise Above OCD.

Council Member Chamberlain reassured the community that the youth and members will have priority in using the cricket fields; she thanked everyone who assisted in the efforts to rescue the injured owlets.

Mayor Baker responded that the Recreation Department determines the pricing for the cricket fields and he recommended reaching out to the Troy Community Foundation to see if a grant may be used to assist with the costs for the youth programs; he recommended that a process be implemented to check for wildlife when developers are developing properties; he thanked the students and their presentation for Rise Above OCD and stressed the importance of using the correct terminology in the proper context.
